- Use JavaScript to generate any additional markup it needs
- ☐ Use JavaScript to enable script-related styles
- ☐ Delivered scripts *à la carte* whenever possible

ACCESSIBILITY

- ☐ Use ARIA landmarks where appropriate
- Use ARIA roles and states to provide users with more detail about widgets
- ☐ Use tabindex to control a user's journey through the page
